Incident: Search Warrant / Narcotics Arrest
Report #: 2010-49794
Location: 1300 block Pierce Street
Arrested: Jordan Cecil
Charges: Three counts S+P Oxycodone, Poss.Xanax, Poss. Drug Paraphernalia, 2 counts Child Neglect
Arrested: Female Juvenile
Charges: Poss. Oxycodone
Seized: Appx. 20 Xanax tablets, Oxycodone tablets , Drug Paraphernalia, 1996 Acura
Synopsis: Detectives obtained information concerning Jordan Cecil, who was actively dealing narcotics from his residence located in the 1300 block of Pierce Street. Jordan conducted several subsequent transactions involving the sale of Oxycodone tablets and was accompanied by a female juvenile during the transactions. This investigation culminated in a search warrant being obtained for the residence. On this date, Jordan was observed outside of the residence and taken into custody by patrol units. The search warrant was then executed, resulting in the discovery of the listed controlled prescription pills and assorted drug paraphernalia.

Synopsis: Between 5/12/10, 2:30pm and 5/13/10, 6:30am , an unidentified suspect gained entry into the victim's vehicle by punching out the lock of the passenger front door. The suspect attempted to steal the vehicle by ripping apart the steering column but was ultimately unsuccessful. It does not appear that anything was taken from the vehicle.

Synopsis: The victim was walking west on Druid Rd., just west of MLK Ave., pushing a stroller. The suspect, who was riding a bicycle, approached her from behind and forcefully grabbed the victim's pocketbook off of her shoulder. The suspect continued west on Druid Rd. before heading south on an undetermined side street. The victim could not provide a good description of the suspect and could only describe the bike as "faded". The victim advised there was \$110 dollars, a gold necklace and a cell phone within the black pocketbook.

Synopsis: Dispatch noticed a suspicious event call in the 1800 block of Emory Dr. She advised Sergeants of this call, as their units were out tonight in undercover vehicles working a burglary surveillance detail. Their officers covertly set up in that area, and an Officer spotted the Toyota P/U (no headlights) pull up next to the house. The suspects grabbed two bicycles from the side of the house, put them in the bed of the truck and then quickly left the area. Officers located the Toyota as it headed north into On Top of the World. Patrol units responded to the area, and when officers attempted a traffic stop, the Toyota fled. The two suspects bailed out of the Toyota (while it was still moving) and fled on foot. Multiple units set up a tight perimeter, and K-9 Officers tracked down the first suspect (SMITH) on Cecelia Ln. Officers maintained the perimeter, and then K-9 Officers tracked down the second suspect (DAVIS) on Kenton Dr.; he was found hiding inside of a garbage can. Both suspects had the money stolen from the vehicle burglary when arrested. DAVIS refused to speak to Detectives and SMITH came up with a ridiculous story as to why he was in that area and ran from the police.
